# CLASSROOM CORNER

## CLASS 1 AND 2 (PUTIPUTI)

A Magical Term of Stories, Numbers, and Drama!  
*Class 1 & 2 Highlights – Term 3*



What a rich and joyful term it has been for Class 1 and 2! Our journey began with a beautiful Literacy Main Lesson that focused on the timeless fables. In Waldorf education, we teach the fables because they speak to the

moral development of the young child, using simple stories to bring deeper life lessons in a way that children can understand and remember. The fables were brought to life in our classroom using finger puppets, which made the storytelling both engaging and imaginative. We worked in pairs to create sentences that captured the heart of each story and complemented them with vibrant drawings that expressed the moods and messages of the tales. Our classroom was filled with creativity, laughter, and the quiet wisdom of these old stories.

After our storytelling adventures, we shifted into the world of numbers with our Maths Main Lesson. Here, our focus was on *place value*. We explored how numbers are constructed and deconstructed using the Hundreds, Tens, and Units columns. We practised adding and subtracting, and even learned to write three- and four-digit numbers in words.

Now, as the term comes to a close, we are turning our attention to the stage! The classroom is buzzing with energy and excitement as we prepare for our Class Play: *Mauī Catches the Sun*, which we will be performing on Thursday, 4 September.




