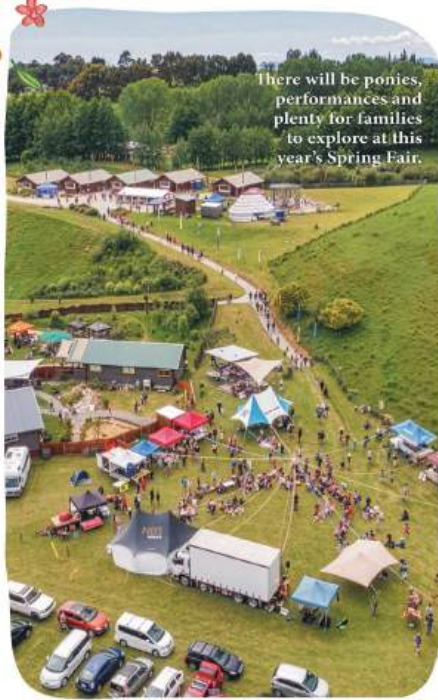

It's a chance to enjoy a good old-fashioned family day out, while also getting a glimpse of the distinctive environment that makes Motueka Steiner School and Kindergarten such an interesting part of our local community.

PONIES, FAIRIES AND A DAY FULL OF FUN

With its farm-style setting and strong emphasis on outdoor and hands-on learning, the school has plenty of space for children to explore, create and get involved, and the Spring Fair makes the most of it.

Children can try candle dipping, weave floral crowns, make rainbow silk streamers and enjoy pony rides. There will be medieval games, Fairyland, the Star Shop, a puppet show, dress-ups a magical hen and a photo booth.

THERE'LL BE PLENTY OF KAI AND MUSIC

Music and performances will run throughout the day on the main stage, positioned near the food stalls so families can enjoy the entertainment while also enjoying nourishing home-made food. There will be plenty of kai to choose from, including, pizza, curries, sausages and BLT Buns, hand-cut chips, fresh salads, ice creams and home-made baking. For the grown-ups, the silent auction will feature around 100 donated items from local businesses and national contributors, with everything from outdoor adventures and accommodation vouchers to artisan food, ceramics and skincare. You can also browse second-hand books and clothing, plants and the handmade felted toys at the Midnight Elves stall.

A CHANCE TO VISIT A FARM STYLE SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT

For families interested in finding out more about the school, the fair is a great

opportunity to look around the campus, meet people from the school community and see the environment for themselves. Enrolments are currently open across the different age groups.

The Spring Fair is organised and supported by the school and kindergarten parents, with funds raised helping support teaching roles that contribute to the school's distinctive programme, including their famous outdoor classroom and farm-to-table programme, and Steiner handwork curriculum.

Entry is by gold coin koha, with most children's activities costing just \$2 each. Parking is free and signposted. As an environmentally friendly community, we warmly encourage you to come by bike whenever possible). The fair is dog-free, and visitors are encouraged to bring reusable shopping bags.

Biodynamic stir and spread: twice a year we spray a substance on the land which we can make ourselves, and which works to increase mauri, or life forces on the land. Biodynamics is all about using and enhancing what is already on the land, so that the farmer doesn't need to go out shopping for chemicals - NPK.

The stirring and spreading is a communal activity we do in a group over about an hour and a half, we get to walk the land and see how it is unfolding.

The next stir, to which all are invited, is at 2.45pm on Sunday 27th September. We start at the hay barn up on 49 School Rd (in front of the 2 cottages). We spread with hearth brushes; bring if you have one.

Pan Eurythmy



PAN EURYTHMY ON SATURDAY MORNINGS FROM SEPTEMBER 26th TO MARCH 20th FROM 9 TO 10 :15AM AT THE MOTUEKA RUDOLF STEINER SCHOOL [165 Robinson Road Lower Moutere](#)

Pan eurythmy is a sequence of rhythmical harmonious movements to music. It was developed in Bulgaria by Peter Denov in the 1900s. He was a spiritual teacher, musician and philosopher.

The movements connect the human being to the heavenly and earthly forces in nature. Pan Eurythmy is danced from spring to autumn outside in nature. There are 28 movements in circle sequence followed by 2 forms celebrating the sun and zodiac, and the virtues of the human being in the pentagram. Every year there is a large gathering in the Rila mountains in Bulgaria, where hundreds of people from all over the world meet to do pan eurythmy together. It is a community building experience. This year I visited the capital of Bulgaria: Sophia, where Peter Denov lived and worked. I did Pan Eurythmy, in the mountains near there with over 200 people from different countries. I experienced an overwhelming feeling of loving community, hope and peace for all humankind. In Bulgaria Pan Eurythmy is danced every morning in most towns in parks and nature, and even in schools.

We would like to bring the seed of this experience to the Motueka School. Everyone from 9 to 99 years of age is most welcome to join us in this meditative celebration to the nature spirits and the divine forces.

We look forward to seeing you all. Feel free to join us any Saturday.

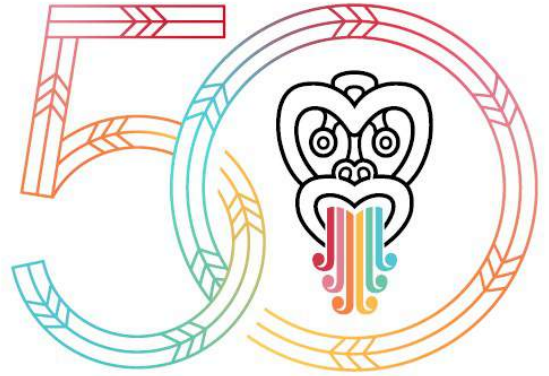
